Cathy says: "This piece has very comfortable ranges overall. I like teaching this at the beginning of the year because the parts are homophonic. This is a great opportunity to work on strong diction and articulation. Adding a bodhrán is fun. We did this piece surrounding the audience. Singing this text is empowering."



I'm Goin' Up a Yonder Walter Hawkins SSAA, accompanied

Cathy says: "This is a staple in my repertoire! Although this says 4 parts, it is fairly accessible. The beginning is all unison and then it moves into a 2-part round. The last 3 pages are trickier. Three parts are basically an F major triad with a couple of difficult measures and a solo or soprano section on top with the melody. Great key change towards the end and back to 3 parts. Soprano range is a little higher at the end staying around E and F5."

Cathy says: "This piece is gorgeous and a great opportunity to work phrasing. It moves from 6/8 to 9/8 throughout, so it also offers a good challenge for newer conductors. It moves to 3 vocal parts for 1 line only and then for the last 4 measures. The melody is beautiful, with some nice soaring lines for sopranos. You will need a strong pianist as there are lots of octaves and running sixteenths. This song is based on the traditional hymn 'At the River'."

Cathy says: "This is very challenging and is actually 4 parts throughout with some very dissonant spots, lots of chromaticism and some voice crossing. They loved this piece, but it took quite some time to pull it together. I would only program if you have strong, low altos to keep this in tune. There is a great range of dynamics as well. I would do this with a larger treble choir.

Cathy says: "Anything with a text by Sara Teasdale is a win for my treble choir. The inside cover gives a nice write-up about the composer, poet and text. We talk a lot about Sara Teasdale texts and knowing about her life helps connect them to the text. I have taught a lot of this on solfege, but there are a couple of gorgeous key changes that make that a little more difficult. Phrasing and vowels are my focus on this."
